

In 1659, Mary Newbury keeps a journal of her voyage from England to the New World and her experiences living as a witch in a community of Puritans near Salem, MA.




**The Color of Fire**

In 1741, Phoebe watches as her town erupts into mass hysteria when the whites in New York City accuse the slaves of planning an uprising.




**Finishing Becca**


**Or Give Me Death**

**The Witch of Blackbird Pond**




**The Mourning Wars**

**YA TURNER**






**Chains**

Sequel: *Forge*




**Fever 1793**


**The Astonishing Life of Octavian Nothing V. 1: The Pox Party**

Jonathan goes off to fight in the Revolutionary War and discovers the real war is being fought within himself.




### The Year of the Hangman




### The Winter People




### Jump Ship to Freedom




### My Brother Sam is Dead

Recounts the tragedy that strikes the Meeker family during the Revolution when one son joins the rebel forces while the rest of the family tries to stay neutral in a Tory town.




### The Ransom of Mercy Carter




### Copper Sun




### Five 4ths of July




### My Lady, Pocahontas




### Indian Captive

A fictional retelling of the experiences of Mary Jemison, who was captured by a Shawnee war party during the French and Indian War.




### Soldier's Secret




### The Serpent Never Sleeps
