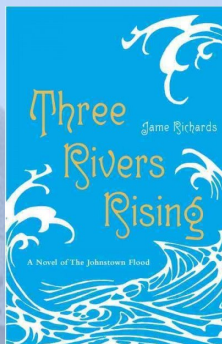


### Three Rivers Rising

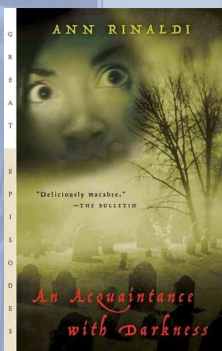


### An Acquaintance with Darkness

When her mother dies and her best friend's family is implicated in the assassination of President Lincoln, Emily goes to live with an uncle she suspects of stealing bodies for research.



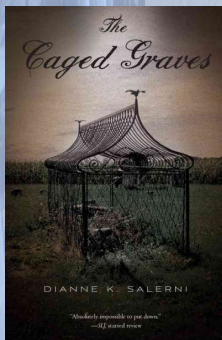
### The Caged Graves

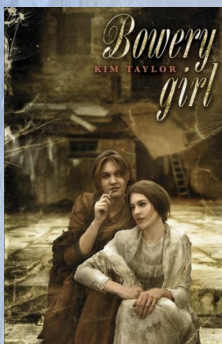


### Bowery Girl

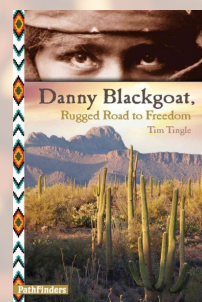


### Danny Blackgoat, Navajo Prisoner

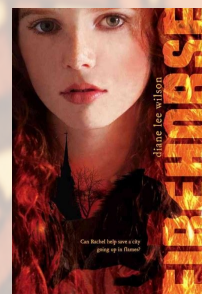


### Firehorse

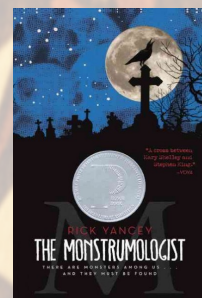


### The Monstrumologist

In 1888, Will Henry chronicles his apprenticeship with Dr. Warthrop, a scientist who hunts and studies real-life monsters.

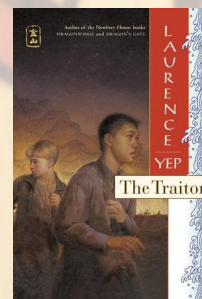


### The Traitor

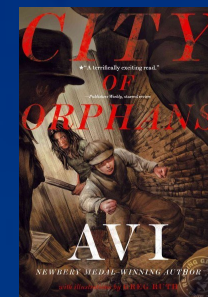

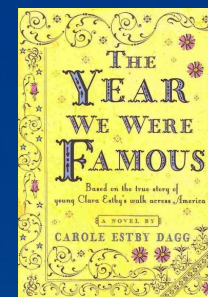


### The Year We Were Famous

Based on the true story, Clara Estby and her mother Helga walk across America in 1896, in an attempt to win a ten thousand dollar prize and save their home from foreclosure.

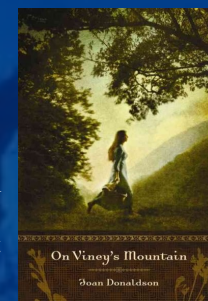


### On Viney's Mountain

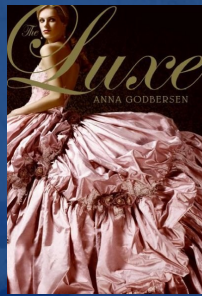

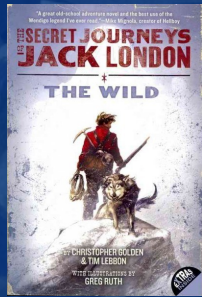
**The Luxe**

In Manhattan in 1899, five teens of different social classes lead dangerously scandalous lives, despite the strict rules of society.



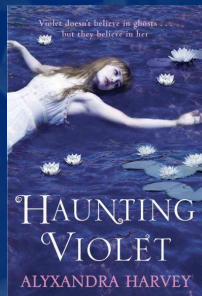
**The Wild**

**YA HARVEY**

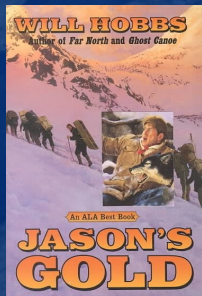

Will Hobbs

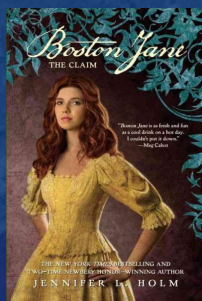
**YA HOBBS (also PB YA)**

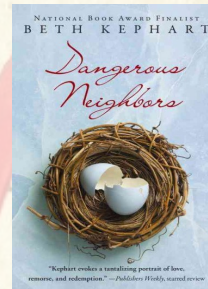
**Boston Jane**

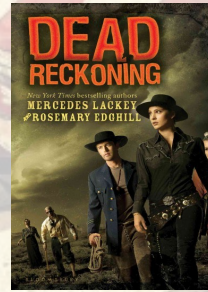
**Dangerous Neighbors**

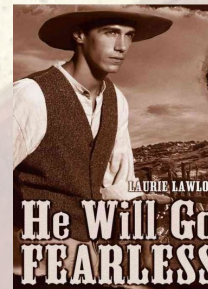
**Dead Reckoning**

With the Civil War ended and Reconstruction begun, Billy resolves to make the dangerous and challenging journey west in search of real fortune.

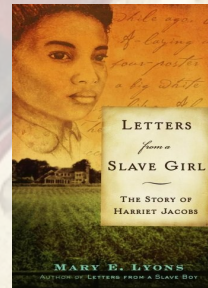


**Letters from a Slave Girl**

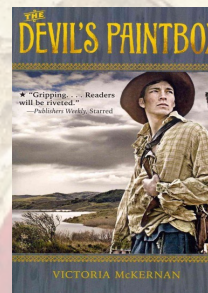


**The Devil's Paintbox**

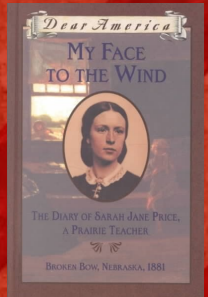
**The Vespertine**

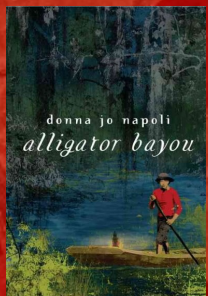
**My Face to the Wind**

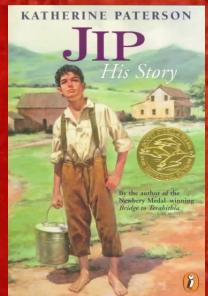
